I encourage those of you who are not members to join and become a part of the great legacy of **Serving** and **Giving Back**.



A Black History Moment



work on uranium isotopes for the atomic bomb.

Black World War II chemist Dr. Samuel P. Massie Jr. is noted for his work on uranium isotopes for the atomic bomb. He made history as the first black faculty member of the U.S. Naval Academy in 1966. Named among great scientists like Marie Curie, George Washington Carver and DNA pioneers Watson and Crick, Dr. Massie conducted decades of work that led to the development of drugs to treat mental illness, malaria, meningitis, gonorrhea, herpes and cancer.

Born in Little Rock, Arkansas, Dr. Massie was a prodigy, graduating from high school at age 13. His drive to study medicine came from his desire to cure his father's severe asthma. After working hard to save money to attend the University of Arkansas in Fayetteville, Dr. Massie was declined admission because he was black. After getting a degree from what is now University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff and a Masters degree from Fisk University, he turned his sights to Iowa State University, where he had to hitchhike to class because housing for blacks was over three miles from campus. He and the lab rats shared a space in the basement of the school until he proved himself worthy to be among the white students.

Before he received his Ph.D, the draft board of Pine Bluff tried to recruit him, citing that he had enough education. With the help of a colleague, Dr. Massie was called to work on the research team for the atomic bomb instead. He was then free to retrieve his doctorate.

In 1954, Dr. Massie published an article on a chemical that led to the development of the anti-psychotic drug Thorazine. Then in 1994, the U.S. Department of Energy created the Dr. Samuel P. Massie Chair of Excellence, a \$14.7 million grant to nine historically black colleges and one Hispanic student to further environmental research.

More than 40K raised by School of the Month Initiative

More than \$40,000 was raised for the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff (UAPB) during the Tom Joyner Foundation School of the Month Initiative. UAPB was the featured institution in November 2010.

Monies raised from the effort directly benefited the UAPB Lifeline fund. The Lifeline Fund is earmarked for students in dire need of financial support – individuals who have exhausted all means for financial support and may have to end their studies at UAPB.

"Our sincere appreciation is extended to those who responded to the Tom Joyner campaign for UAPB," says Chancellor Lawrence A. Davis, Jr. "You are helping to make a difference for our students."

The final confirmed amount was approximately \$41, 087.83 according to Dr. Margaret Martin-Hall, director of the Title III Program and the Office of University Relations and Development.

"Tom Joyner, the nationally esteemed disc jockey, has a long history of providing scholarship support to students attending Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU)," says Dr. Hall. "We are pleased that he selected [UAPB]. Not unlike other HBCUs, the support from the Joyner Foundation helps fill a void at our institution."

Booker named National Alumni President

Calvin E. Booker, Sr., a 1979 graduate of the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff (UAPB), has been named President of the UAPB/AM&N National Alumni

Association. A Hamburg, Arkansas native, President Booker stated that he has had the privilege and honor of serving in many different capacities on behalf of, and in support of the institution for more than 30 years.

"From my first involvement with UAPB as a student athlete on the Golden Lions' football team (1975-79), through coaching in our University's football program, to serving as Assistant to the Dean of Education, working in the Alumni Office, as well as working in student recruitment, I have labored tirelessly for UAPB," **said Booker upon reflection.** "Additionally, I have also served on various University boards and committees, including the Foundation Board. In 1997, I had the singular pleasure of serving as Commencement speaker for our graduates. Clearly, it has been my privilege to have had opportunities to serve in many capacities and dimensions."

Focusing on the key areas of recruitment and retention, and also on the potential development of an alumnisponsored dormitory and/or an alumni house, we can compassionately support the needs of present-day and future UAPB students as never before.

He currently serves as Corporate Vice President of Public Affairs for the Southern Group of Waste Management Inc. in Atlanta, Georgia. He joined Waste Management in July 1991 in Dallas, Texas, and has become an invaluable asset to the company utilizing his knowledge and relationships with local, state and federal legislators. He is responsible for the organizational development and strategic implementation of Governmental Affairs, Community Relations and Communications programs across 12 Southeastern states and the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico.

He is also the Chairman Emeritus of the Corporate Round Table (the financial entity) of the National Black Caucus of State Legislators, after serving four years as the Chairman of the Board. He received his degree in Education from UAPB and obtained his Master's degree in Secondary Education from Prairie View A&M University in Prairie View, Texas.

President Booker became a member of the UAPB staff for eleven years as Assistant to the Dean of Education and Coordinator of Student Recruitment. In the late 1980s, Mr. Booker became the youngest person to be elected to the Pine Bluff City Council. Since moving to Atlanta, Calvin Booker also served as President and Vice President for the UAPB Alumni Chapter. He and his wife Janetta, who is also a graduate of UAPB and their son Calvin, Jr. are active members of the Atlanta community.

"I believe our most important mission as an Alumni Association is to support our Alma Mater by delivering high-caliber and far-reaching alumni support for the well-being of our administration, faculty, and students now and in the future," **says Booker.** "Under a theme of *Compassionate and Committed Service*, we have an opportunity to fulfill this mission in many ways."
